The West Texas Lighthouse is excited to introduce several new writing instruments to our Skilcraft product line. These writing instruments will be marketed to all the federal agencies in the United States and government agencies in the State of Texas.

The first line of new products is made from recycled water bottles. Water bottles that would normally go into a landfill are recycled and make the Eco-Bottle retractable gel pen and a highlighter.

Another new pen we will be introducing is the Erasable *Re-write*. This is an erasable pen, which is used in the same way a pencil is used. This will be available in both

a retractable and stick gel pen.

These pens will be available as of April 1, 2017. Developing new products, like these, allows us to continue to hire people who are blind or visually impaired.

We have been making writing instruments for over 40 years and we have the technical expertise to produce these products and this will be a big boost to the Lighthouse. Dave Wells, Executive Director

Jesse remembers the hotel being down the street. He said on days when they did not bring their lunch, some of the employees would walk over to the Roosevelt Hotel for lunch. He said the restaurant in the hotel was called the Dutch Diner and was located on the first floor.
