Our Midland Operation Moves to New Location



The West Texas Lighthouses' 3rd location in Midland, has finally moved into its permanent location. The renovations on 211 South Lee Street are finally complete and everyone reported to the new location on September 30th. We want to thank the Midland Downtown Lion's Club for letting us lease part of their building while our remodeling was taking place.

"We really enjoy the new location it's much bigger and we have more

room, it's really nice" said Allen Sigler, lighthouse employee.

The Lighthouse started the Midland location in 2018. Several people who are blind and visually impaired reached out to the Lighthouse and expressed their desire for work, but were unable to find work in the Midland/Odessa area. The unemployment rate for adults visually impaired is 70%.

Continuing with our mission to provide jobs for people who are

blind or visually impaired, we started the process of adding a satellite location to this area.

We currently have 10 blind and visually impaired employees and a supervisor. They assemble several different styles of writing instruments and neck lanyards for our state and federal customers.


